THE PHOTOGRAPHY OF ANDREW PIELAGE AND HIS STUDENTS

ur August Open House brought with it beautiful weather and a visit by a renowned photographer and his students. Andrew Pielage (pronounced *Peel - Ledge*) is an internationally recognized name in travel and architectural photography. Based in Phoenix, Arizona, Pielage is on a mission to photograph all of Frank Lloyd Wright's remaining designs.

Born to an adventurous mother and a geologist father, his childhood was spent exploring the dusty backroads of the American Southwest. This constant desert travel rooted his artistic soul in landscape photography.

In his hometown, Pielage discovered the beautiful relationship of landscape and design in the architecture of Frank Lloyd Wright. Wright inspired his passion for this relationship and his mission to photograph all of Wright's remaining designs. Called his #500fllwproject, Andrew has photographed 129 of the 431 remaining Wright designs thus far.

This year, after nearly 40 years, the cousins and their spouses gathered in Madison, leading to their visit to *Uncle Seth's* cottage during our July 14th Open House (Photo below).

Beth, my wife and SPCC Board member, and I had the opportunity to attend the annual meeting of the Frank Lloyd Wright Building Conservancy in Detroit. The meeting was attended by Wright building owners, Wright public site operators and people interested in Frank Lloyd Wright. There were presentations and tours of the architecture of Wright and Wright-like homes in the Detroit area. Of special interest was the Friday evening dinner for Wright owners and public site operators where we had the opportunity to discuss challenges and opportunities of managing a public Wright site. There are now about 20 Wright homes available for rent to the public, following our business plan started in 1992.

As we look to the future, the SPCC has undertaken a study over the past year to establish an endowment fund to sustain the Conservancy's financial future. Planned giving is a win-win situation for both donors and non-profit organizations, providing financial benefits and tax breaks for the donors while securing a stable source of support for the nonprofit. More information will be available as our Board of Directors contemplates this important step in securing the future of the Seth Peterson Cottage.



Since 2011, Pielage has made a pilgrimage to Taliesin in Spring Green to lead two photography workshops each summer. "The Wisconsin journey is a highlight of my summer," says Pielage. The first workshop, aimed at beginners, covers everything from "how to turn on your camera" to mastering aperture, shutter speed, and ISO, guiding participants to become proficient in manual shooting by the end. The second workshop is for intermediate photographers, focusing on digital darkroom techniques using Adobe Lightroom. Both workshops offer exclusive access to Taliesin, with students staying on the 800-acre estate for three days, allowing them to explore and photograph every corner of the property.

With over 100 alumni from these workshops, Pielage says his gatherings are always a blast, blending artistry and a shared passion for Wright's work. This enthusiasm led him to expand beyond workshops to offer unique "Architectural Tours." These tours shift the focus from technical instruction to enjoying the company of fellow Wright enthusiasts and exploring his designs. For his first Wisconsin Tour, Pielage chose the Seth Peterson Cottage. Managing 12 photographers while trying to capture the Seth Peterson Cottage in just two hours was a challenge, but as you can see from his students' photos to the right, their visit was a huge success.

APPLICANTS SOUGHT FOR 2025 VISSER HISTORICAL PRESERVATION AWARD

arch 15, 2025 is the deadline for applications for the 2025 Kristin Visser Historical Preservation Award.

The award, selected by the directors of the Seth Peterson Cottage Conservancy, is presented every other year to an individual or organization in recognition of past work in historical preservation of a Frank Lloyd Wright or Prairie School building in Wisconsin or a contiguous state. In general, buildings constructed between 1900 and 1959 are preferred, with the restoration work having been substantially completed within the two calendar years prior to the year of application. The 2025 award will be given for work done between 2022 and 2024.

The award is in the amount of \$10,000.

Applicants are asked to support their applications with a statement fully describing their restoration project, including its state of completion, a supporting statement from the building contractor and/or architect, a letter or letters of support from scholars and/or working professionals familiar with the project, photographic evidence of work completed, and any other supporting materials. Applications will be judged by a panel of members of the Seth Peterson Cottage Conservancy, along with several outside experts/scholars.

The award recipient will be announced on April 15, 2025, and the award presented at the Seth Peterson Cottage on June 8, 2025.

The award is named in honor of Kristin Visser, who was instrumental in the restoration of the Seth Peterson Cottage and a tireless worker on its behalf. She is the author of *Frank Lloyd Wright and the Prairie School in Wisconsin*, and, with John Eifler, A.I.A., *Frank Lloyd Wright's Seth Peterson Cottage: Rescuing a Lost Masterwork*. Visser, who was a planner for the Wisconsin State Department of Natural Resources, died in 1998 at the age of 48.

The Seth Peterson Cottage, located in Mirror Lake State Park, near Wisconsin Dells, is Frank Lloyd Wright's final Wisconsin commission (1958) and, at only 880 square feet, one of his smallest. It was rescued from ruin by the concerted efforts of a local group of lakeshore property owners, spearheaded by Audrey Laatsch, and restored through a public/private partnership effort. Dedicated in 1992, it serves today as a unique rental cottage, managed by the Seth Peterson Cottage Conservancy.


